Church Accompanist

Looking for a proficient pianist to lead music on Sunday mornings for St. Francis Church (Rio Rancho). Sundays only, 9am-12noon. \$150/Sunday, 48 Sundays a year + Christmas and Easter. You would receive music 1 month ahead of time in order to prepare. The musician needs to be versatile in styles, able to improvise a little bit, and comfortable accompanying a singing congregation. They will play a variety of styles: classical, 19th c. hymns, popular music, American spirituals, and jazz. Most of all they need to have an inclusive heart (we are an LGBTQ affirming congregation), an open mind, and be self-motivated.

Church Minister of Music

Looking for someone who is passionate about leading choral and congregational singing at St. Francis Church (Rio Rancho). This is a quarter-time position with a salary of \$13,000/yr. They will work Sundays, 9am-12noon, 1x/mo. staff meetings, and 1x/mo. meeting with the lead priest, as well as their own hours during the week selecting music and practicing. They need to have some knowledge of hymns and sacred music (but it need not be extensive). They will be in charge of planning and leading the hymns, solos, and choir pieces for the congregation, utilizing a diversity of styles: classical, 19th c. hymns, popular music, American spirituals, and jazz. They should be able to work with adults and also children and youth. Most importantly they need to have a passion for singing and leading song, an inclusive heart (we are an LGBTQ affirming congregation), flexible, able to collaborate, and self-motivated to find and learn new repertoire.

(REMINDER) URGENT - NEW HQ DUES POLICY. DON'T BE LATE IN PAYING!

The AGO national office has implemented a new policy concerning dues payment and their due date. As of now, there is **NO GRACE PERIOD** after the due date of your renewal. Memberships renew at the beginning of each month of the year, based on the member's date of joining the AGO or on July 1st, if the member was a member in 2014, when the ONCARD database system became effective.

The new policy DOES NOT provide for any grace period of paying dues beyond the renewal date. So, if you have a renewal date of July 1st and do not make your payment by that date, your membership will be cancelled approximately two weeks later. This pattern of processing will occur with every renewal date during the year. The AGO accepts payments by both credit cards and personal check.

You can pay your dues by credit card in two ways. First, you can go online into your ONCARD account, select RENEW DUES AND SUBSCRIPTION, and follow the prompts (you will be asked to confirm / update your membership profile). You can print a copy of the invoice and/or receipt (after the payment is processed). Second, you can call the AGO office at 1-212-870-2310 and pay your dues with a credit card over the phone. AGO staff can also help you with any ONCARD problem. **There will be a new computer system soon which requires all members to have an email address.**
